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SIMPLIFIED ACCOUNTABLE STRUCTURE

Leadership is incredibly important in any church. We need clergy, staff, and laity, working together to cast a vision and equip our members to live into it. For most of my time serving in the church, lay leadership has been embodied by ministry teams like nurture, outreach and witness, and five committees called administrative council, finance, trustees, staff parish relations, and nominations. Each of them come with their own members, set of meetings, and charges. In some churches they work together, while in others they can feel siloed and as if they are doing their own thing. Recently, the conference and district have introduced some new structures for leadership meant to shape our teams to be more effective and free members of our congregations from a deluge of meetings. One of these is called the Simplified Accountable Structure. In our last admin council meeting we began discussing it and have decided to enter into a season of discernment to see if it is the right fit for Englewood UMC. In this article we will unpack this new organization of leadership, but I also wanted to extend an invitation. A key part of this new way to do committees is accountability and the transparency it takes to make that accountability possible. That's why we are bringing you along in the process and keeping you informed so that you understand it and can offer your feedback.

'Why' is an important question to ask in any situation. Why is it that we are pursuing the possibility of implementing this structure at Englewood UMC? There is a technical reason that I have already alluded to. For one, it frees up many of our members from serving on multiple committees so that they can be the hands and feet of our ministries to the community. It will also mean fewer meetings in general. Those two ideas are great, but the greater 'why' to me is the opportunity to move past meetings that focus on what came before to a focus on the vision for what we want to be as a church. Our 'why' greatly aligns with what is presented in Kay Kotan's book, 'Mission Possible':

- Efficiency The more time we spend in meetings the less time we spend in ministry with the community
- Alignment Rather than siloed teams, we can now work together towards a common vision and goal
- Missional Focus Changing from an internal focus of being served to an outward motivation to make disciples
- Accountability One of the things that accompanies this structural transition is transparency. We have to be better about transparency with one another and with the congregation through regular communications like quarterly town halls. We can also improve on inviting members to observe the gathering of the board. The only stipulation is that SPRC matters are reserved for a closed session that only the board can be a part of.

'What' is another important question. What does the Simplified Accountable Structure look like? Simply put, it is the

combining of the admin council, trustees, finance, and SPRC into one board. That board is charged with shaping and sharing the vision with our members and ministry teams and setting the goals and guidelines for us to live into and make decisions. This would be composed of around nine people with one chair and representation from United Methodist Men, United Women in Faith, our youth, our treasurer, and our lay member to Annual Conference. Like our current committees, we would have, at least, three classes of three people committed to serve for three years. Each year a class of three will rotate off, while another class of three will be set to rotate on.

Another 'what' question deals with the benefits of making such a change. For one, we have all four of these committees working together rather than being siloed. Decision making can now happen faster and with fewer meetings because everyone is equipped to be on the same page. Another benefit comes from what will be driving our meetings going forward. Our goal is to be motivated by our vision and not the structures that tend to guide our churches like the old budget, the old calendar, or even the building needs. This committee would not be about micromanaging the ministries of the church, but setting goals for our ministry teams and staff to help them make their own decisions while living into our unified vision for what the church could be.

Finally, accountability is important for this new leadership structure to work. Transparency continues to be one of our biggest drivers. Our congregation is already invited to attend any of our admin council meetings, but we'd strive to make that invitation even clearer with the new model. The only thing that is not open to the public are staff parish relations matters which deal with the staff and are closed sessions. We will seek to announce through the bulletin and newsletter decisions and happenings with our board and we will try new approaches like regular town hall meetings where you can hear what is going on and give us feedback. In fact, that's the next opportunity we are working on to provide information about this new structure of leadership and include you in the discernment process. Stay tuned, as we will announce shortly a town hall where you can attend to hear more about the Simplified Accountable Structure, ask questions, and begin giving us feedback.

Many of our United Methodist Congregations are making this move for the reasons I shared above. After hearing why and seeing the ways it reinvigorated their leadership, we are excited for us to consider that here. Be in prayer for our admin council as we wrestle with this and be sure to be in constant communication with us if you have any questions. You are a part of this process with us and the surest way for us to succeed is for us to work together on this.




Vacation Bible School 2024
